HOLIDAY FIRST NIGHT PARADE & ROAD CLOSURES SATURDAY, DECEMBER 2, 2017

Starting at 3:00 PM – Rivulet St (between W Hartford Ave and N Main St) and Elm St (between W Hartford Ave and Rivulet St) to include Sayles St. will be closed to allow parade participants to line up.

You will NOT be allowed to drive in this area to drop off people at a float, etc. Plan on walking in

Starting at 4:15 PM the following roads will be closed to accommodate the parade:

- North Main Street (Rt 122) from Rivulet St, south to the Center.
- South Main Street (Rt 122) from High Street, north to the Center.
- Douglas Street (Rt 16) From Carney Street, east to the Center.
- Mendon Street (Rt 16) from Oak Street, west to the Center.

At the conclusion of the parade (estimated 6:00- 6:30PM), the Mendon St, Douglas St and South Main St will be opened.

North Main Street, between Snowling Rd and the Center will remained closed until 8:00 PM.

The following Detours will be in place during the Parade:

- South Main Street (Rt 122) – will be directed left onto High Street, right onto Carney Street and left onto Douglas Street.
- North Main Street (After parade passes Snowling Rd) will be directed right onto Snowling Rd, left onto Douglas Street.
- Douglas Street will directed right onto Carney Street, left onto High Street and right onto South Main Street.
- Mendon Street will be directed right onto Oak Street, slight left onto Granite Street, left onto East Hartford Ave.

Anyone traveling through town east or west is advised to utilize East and West Hartford Avenues to avoid the parade and detour areas.

At 4:15 PM all traffic leaving Hannaford's Plaza will directed south ONLY. Once the parade steps off at 4:30 PM all traffic in Hannaford's Plaza will be held in place until the parade passes the last exit/entrance.

Detour signs will be placed along the detour routes to assist motorists.
