# **Status Update**

**Absentee Voting:** While there will still be in-person voting on Election Day, May 19, it is STRONGLY recommended that all registered voters wishing to cast a ballot do so by Absentee Voting. For more information, click <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>.

**Waive Late Fees and Penalties:** On April 22, the Board of Selectmen voted to waive late fees and interest on water and sewer bills due between March 10th and June 30th. Please note payments must be received before June 30th to qualify.

**Updates on Face Coverings/Masks:** On April 7, the Uxbridge Board of Health issued an <u>advisory</u> recommending that face coverings or masks be worn when outside of the home. Face coverings help reduce disease spread, protect you and essential workers, and ease the burden on healthcare facilities. Please note:

- It is especially important to wear a face covering in places where social distancing is difficult, such as grocery stores, pharmacies, or other stores. Remember, face coverings do not replace social distancing. Stay six feet away!
- Tony Giunta, Manager of Hannaford Bros. Supermarket on face coverings: "We do what we can to protect our employees and customers. Sending our employees home if they feel ill and having them wear masks at work are two things we can do to minimize risk of coronavirus transmission. We hope customers will wear masks to protect us and each other, because it's the right thing to do. We are a big part of the Uxbridge community and most of our associates have grown up and live in town. This should be something families would support."
- Certain cities and towns in Massachusetts as well as all of Rhode Island now require all people to wear face coverings or masks in stores. Noncompliance may result in fines. Please be aware of the local ordinances in other towns.

**Extension of School Closures:** On Tuesday, Governor Baker announced that all Massachusetts public and private schools would be closed through the end of the school year. **Getting Outside**: Fresh air and exercise are vital to staying healthy and coping with stress right now. Click <u>here</u> to see a list of open spaces for walking or recreation. In order to enjoy these spaces responsibly, please remember the following:


- Keep your distance- Staying 6 feet apart may require stepping off of the trail or
  waiting for others to pass. Be especially aware of your surroundings when in parking areas. Dogs should be leashed at all times, and waste should be picked up and
  taken with you. Wear your face covering!
- Be flexible— If the place you want to visit is crowded when you arrive, come back later or visit another place. <u>Do not park illegally when parking lots are full.</u>

## **FDA Guidance on Groceries:**

Worried about the virus on your groceries? The FDA has produced updated guidance regarding disinfecting groceries, stating that there is no evidence of food packaging being associated with the transmission of COVID-19. If you wish, product packaging can be wiped down and left to dry as an extra precaution. Still, the most important way to protect yourself is to wash your hands thoroughly (for at least 20 seconds) when you return home.
