COVID-19 in Uxbridge

The graph below shows the **total** number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Uxbridge (not the number of cases each day). It is important to note that these are only cases that have been confirmed by PCR testing at an approved lab.



NEW COVID-19 SYMPTOMS AND CDC UPDATES

The CDC added congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting and diarrhea to its <u>list of COVID-19 symptoms</u>. On June 25th, the CDC <u>updated and expanded</u> the list of who is at increased risk for getting severely ill from COVID-19.

Quarantining and Travel: Confused? Us Too.

As the different states reopen and close at different rates due to COVID 19, it can be confusing what that means for domestic travel. Currently, people travelling to Massachusetts, including MA residents returning home from out of state, must quarantine for 14 days. However, as of July 1st, people travelling from Rhode Island, Connecticut, Vermont, New Hampshire, Maine, New York, and New Jersey do not have to quarantine. Additionally, workers designated as essential by the government do not have to quarantine if they are travelling for work. States nearby have different variations on their travel guidelines so it is important to check in to see if you will have to quarantine when travelling out of state. Some nearby state travel restrictions can be found here for Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, and New Hampshire. Unfortunately, international travel restrictions still remain confusing and are changing everyday. There is currently a Level 4 Travel Advisory to anywhere outside of the US due to the pandemic, meaning that all nonessential travel should stop. For people trying to return to the US, the reentry guidelines can be found here. For those needing to travel internationally, a country specific list of travel guidelines can be found here. In summary, it is important to refrain from international travel unless it is absolutely necessary and domestic travel should be conducted with caution and adherence to your state's guidelines.
