

Updates on Town Meeting

The Uxbridge Town Meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 17 at the Valley Chapel on Hunter Road. More information will be posted on the town's website. The Board of Selectmen voted to move forward with the meeting at Valley Chapel at their meeting on June 8 and are making accommodations to reduce health risks associated with COVID-19 including limiting the length of meeting to 90 minutes and spacing seating to maintain social distancing. On June 2, based on evidence that COVID is more easily spread in indoor spaces, the Board of Health recommended that the Town Meeting be held in an outdoor space unless a suitable indoor location is identified that addresses safety concern for all voters. 500 Million Wins

A <u>recent article</u> published in *Nature* conducted by researchers at the University of California at Berkeley reported that due to stay at home orders and other policies, the world was able to avoid 500 million cases of COVID 19. Globally, the study reported that 62 million cases were avoided due to shelter-in-place and similar policies. The success of these policies are dependent upon a worldwide effort to stay at home. Uxbridge is a small but significant part of that global effort, so keep up the great work!

Outdoor Dining: What to Expect

As outdoor dining begins to reopen in Uxbridge and across the state it's important to know the new rules and regulations that will be in place! Restaurants will be required to keep their tables six feet apart. Be aware that this may place you closer to other groups than anticipated as chairs etc. need to fit within the space. Groups will be limited to six people and all members of your group will have to provide and name and phone number for contact tracing purposes. The full description of regulations and what indoor dining will look like once it opens can be found here on the state's website.

What's Next in Phase 2?

Parks Are Back In Business!

All town-owned parks and open spaces are now open but remember that the Governor's Prohibition on Gatherings Over 10 and Mask-covering Order are still in place. River Bend Farm and West Hill Dam are open for business, but visitor centers and bathrooms are currently closed. West Hill has a portable restroom available. Bring your own drinking water and make sure to follow these recommendations for safely and responsibly using parks during COVID.









Good News Corner!

Last week about 100 individuals gathered on the Town Common in recognition of Black Lives Matter. They did so as safely as possible by wearing masks and, although this was difficult, maintaining an appropriate distance from those not from the same household. It is becoming clearer with emerging evidence that being outdoors reduces the chance of spreading the virus by diluting it in the open air. This event was coordinated by a former member of the Board of Health and her daughter, who set the stage for a peaceful and safe event. The Uxbridge Police contributed their presence and assistance also, safely masked and distanced from participants. Thanks to you all!
