CONSERVATION PUBLIC HEARING/MEETING NOTICES

The Uxbridge Conservation Commission will hold a Public Hearing on Monday, April 6th at 6:30PM.

Pursuant to Governor Baker's March 12, 2020 Order Suspending Certain Provisions of the Open Meeting Law, G.L. c. 30A, §18, and the Governor's March 15, 2020 Order imposing strict limitation on the number of people that may gather in one place, this meeting of the Uxbridge Conservation Commission will be conducted via remote participation to the greatest extent possible. NOTICE OF INTENT filed by Crossman Engineering on behalf of John Sahagian for work at 290 Millville Rd, Map 30 Parcel 2768. The proposed project is to construct a 75,200 square foot marijuana cultivation facility, new 1,500 ft long public roadway with cul-de-sac, and subdivision for future industrial or commercial uses. In addition, the project includes exterior site work including land clearing, paved parking lots, landscaped areas, utilities, and stormwater management. Approximately 11 acres of land will be disturbed including 4.2 acres of impervious surface in Bordering Land Subject to Flooding and the buffer zone to a Bordering Vegetated Wetland.
