On July 16, 2022 Governor Baker signed into law "An Act Relative to Extending Certain State of Emergency Accommodations," which among other things, extended provisions pertaining to the Open Meeting Law to March 31, 2023. Specifically, this extension allows public bodies to continue holding meetings remotely without a quorum of the public body physically present at a meeting location, and to provide "adequate, alternative" access to remote meetings. The Act does not make any new changes to the Open Meeting Law other than extending the expiration date of the temporary provisions regarding remote meetings from July 15, 2022, to March 31, 2023.

Pursuant to the same, the Uxbridge Finance Committee ("FinCom") shall conduct a meeting on Monday, Oct. 3, 2022 both In Person at the Board of Selectmen/Upper Meeting Room located at the Uxbridge Town Hall, 21 S Main St Uxbridge, MA 01569 and by remote participation via Zoom.

A public body must post notice of the date, time and place of a meeting at least 48 hours in advance of said meeting, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays. The notice must include a list of topics the chair reasonably anticipates will be discussed at the meeting, specific enough so that the public can understand the agenda. Once posted, notice may be updated with additional topics, but only if re-posted 48 hours in advance of the meeting in the same manner as above. If a sudden, generally unexpected set of circumstances demands immediate action by a public body, an "emergency" meeting may be held, and notice shall be posted as soon as possible prior to said emergency meeting.
