COVID-19 Weekly Update

Status Update

Face Coverings: The CDC now recommends wearing cloth face coverings in all public settings where social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores, pharmacies and workplaces). COVID-19 can be spread in the community by people who have the virus but do not have symptoms. In accordance with this recommendation, the Board of Health has issued the <u>following advisory</u>:

The Uxbridge Board of Health advises all Uxbridge residents, and people who work in places of business and government facilities, that a mask be worn at all times outside of a home or other dwelling. This applies to people in all public spaces, outdoor spaces and private businesses.

Please remember that medical masks and N95 respirators should be reserved for health workers and first responders. More information on homemade face coverings can be found here.

Case Count: To date, 13 cases of COVID-19 have been reported among Uxbridge residents. This number represents people whose disease status has been confirmed with a test and it includes those who are currently ill as well as those who have recovered. Because testing is still limited, **this count underestimates the actual number of cases in the town**. For this reason, it is still critical for residents to continue taking protective measures such as following the <u>Governor's Stay at Home advisory</u> and practicing social distancing.

If you are sick: The main symptoms of COVID-19 are fever, cough, and shortness of breath, although a <u>range of symptoms</u> have been reported including loss of ability to smell and taste as well as diarrhea.

- If you experience signs consistent with COVID-19, please call your doctor for guidance on next steps and availability of testing. If you do not have a primary physician, call your local Emergency Room for guidance.
- Most cases of COVID-19 are mild and do not require medical attention; if you
 have mild symptoms, do not leave your home except to get medical care,
 and do not visit public places.
- If you have difficulty breathing, seek medical attention immediately.

Tips for Shopping:

- The CDC is recommending only taking trips for essential items for the next two weeks.
- Dedicated hours for seniors (60+): Hannaford (7-8 AM) and CVS (9-10 AM)
- Reusable bags are currently not permitted.
- Plan ahead by making a list to decrease time in the store and limit trips to once per week.
- Bring wipes to disinfect your cart before use.
- Wear your face covering and wash your hands as soon as you return home.

Protect Essential Personnel! Though many of us are staying home, essential workers such as postal workers and grocery store staff are still going in to work while trying to stay healthy, and you can help. Please consider leaving disinfecting wipes in your mailbox for your mail carrier. When visiting stores, keep groups as small as possible (go alone if you can!) and pay with a card, if possible.
